

Northwind Art invites artists across the Peninsula to enter Small Expressions: the juried show to open Nov. 3 at Jeanette Best Gallery in Port Townsend.

The deadline to enter is Oct. 27, and the link to the entry form is found at the top of the homepage: https://north-windart.org. Now in its 22nd year, Small Expressions is a juried exhibit designed to encourage art buying for the gift-giving season. The show is open to all media including jewelry; entries must be original, entirely the work of the entrant, and executed within the last three years. No work shall exceed 16" in any direction, including frame and mount. Small Expressions will stay on display through Dec. 31, and will include four awards to participating artists: the \$500 juror's choice prize and three \$300 merit awards.

Primarily an oil painter, Linda says she is drawn to paint "en plein air", inspired by the intensity of color, light, atmosphere and the energies of the world outside. She



Artist of the Month – Carol Reynolds





Harbor Art Gallery

Harbor Art Gallery in Port Angeles will feature the work of artist Nathan Shields throughout the month of October. Nathan will be showcasing two new series of block prints, titled Inky Caps and Jitterbugs.









Known as reduction prints, these images are carved into a linoleum block a little at a time, with successive layers of ink in different colors printed onto paper.

"It's kind of a time-consuming process; the pieces for this show have been in the works since February," Shields said.

The reduction process ensures that only a limited edition of original prints exist.

A Port Angeles resident, Nathan has had a lifelong love of art making. He currently teaches art to high school students at Crescent School in Joyce, along with math and computer science.

Visitors can meet Nathan and other artists at the gallery (114 N Laurel St, Port Angeles) during the Second Saturday Art Walk from 4-7pm on October 14th. His work will be displayed in the special Featured Artist Room throughout the month.
